Mountains, Music & Moonshine Tour Itinerary

Wednesday, June 10, 2026

Park your cars at Wes and Karen's house this morning and join us for an 10-day tour to the Smoky Mountains. Today we spend getting to know one another as we pass the time away making our way to the south side of Chicago where we spend the night. Enjoy an included lunch at the Norske Nook in Osseo, WI. Overnight Hammond, IN. (L)

Thursday, June 11, 2026

This afternoon we tour the Louisville Slugger Factory where we watch baseball bats being made. We then learn about the horse racing industry with a tour of Churchill Downs. You can enjoy an included "Drury Inn Kickback" evening meal at the Drury Inn in Louisville, KY. (B,L,S)

Friday, June 12, 2026

A big part of the heritage of Kentucky is bourbon. Today we visit the Jim Beam Distillery and then make our way to Nashville, TN where we will tour the Country Music Hall of Fame and the famous RCA Studio B. This evening we will board the Showboat General Jackson for the evening dinner cruise. Overnight Nashville, TN (B,S)

Saturday, June 13, 2026

Our first stop today is the Belle Meade Plantation, now officially titled Belle Meade Historic Site and Winery, is a historic farm established in 1807 in Nashville, Tennessee, built, owned, and controlled by five generations of the Harding-Jackson family for nearly a century. The farm, named "Belle Meade" (beautiful meadow), grew to encompass 5,400 acres at its zenith and used a labor force of 136 enslaved workers. The farm's centerpiece was a Greek revival mansion built in 1853. Belle Meade Farm gained a national reputation in the latter half of the 19th century for breeding thoroughbred horse racing stock, notably a celebrated stallion, Iroquois. In the Civil War, when the Union Army took control of Nashville, the mansion was pillaged and looted by soldiers who spent weeks quartered there; the owner was imprisoned. In the aftermath, the plantation recovered, but with greatly reduced capacity. Roughly half of the enslaved persons returned as paid employees after the war and lived in their own homes nearby. After a financial downturn in 1893 and later the death of the owner and his heir, the estate was dismantled and sold in parcels in 1906. It now has been restored and is on the National Register of Historic Places. While here we will enjoy an included meal in their carriage house and stables.

A local step on guide shows us the highlights of Nashville this afternoon. This evening we will visit one of Nashville's oldest traditions. The Grand Ole Opry features country music's stars, superstars and rising stars all on one stage. Overnight Nashville, TN. (B, L)

Sunday, June 14, 2026

This morning we make our way east to Pigeon Forge, TN where Dolly Parton has a theme park "Dollywood" named after her, and we will spend the afternoon here. Enjoy the many shows that are held throughout the park and ride the coal fired train around the park. Tonight we attend the Hatfield and McCoy Dinner Show. The Country tonight will be our final show of the evening. Overnight Pigeon Forge, TN (B,S)

Monday, June 15, 2026

Today we will learn about the life of Dolly Parton and how she left home right after she graduated to pursue her career. We also learn about those famous Bush's baked beans as we pay a visit to their visitor center. Tonight we attend the Dixie Stampede. Dolly Parton's Stampede in Pigeon Forge features friendly competition, thrilling horse riding stunts, spectacular special effects, phenomenal music productions, and a four-course feast. This show and meal is always one people enjoy. Overnight, Pigeon Forge, TN (B,S)

Tuesday, June 16, 2026

Our step on guide today takes us through the Smoky Mountain National Park. We stop along many vistas and overlooks as we learn about one of America's most visited national parks. We hope to pay a visit to the Dahl Chainsaw Art Shop in Gatlinburg on the way. This afternoon we visit the home of George and Edith Vanderbilt. The Biltmore House was designed by architect Richard Morris Hunt and is America's Largest Home spanning 175,000 square feet, which is more than four acres of floor space. The 250-room French Renaissance chateau includes 35 bedrooms, 43 bathrooms, and 65 fireplaces!

Adjacent to the Biltmore House are 75 acres of formal and informal gardens designed by renowned American landscape architect, Frederick Law Olmsted. We enjoy a self-guided tour of the home and drive through the 8000 acre Biltmore Estate. Overnight Asheville, NC. (B)

Wednesday, June 17, 2026

We visit Frankfort, KY this afternoon and visit one of the United States most popular Distilleries. Buffalo Trace sells out every day for their tours. So we will pay a visit and find out why they are so popular! Overnight Drury Inn, Louisville, KY where you can enjoy an included evening kickback. (B,S)

Thursday, June 18, 2026

Did you know there is a large Amish community in Arthur, IL? Today we visit their community, learn about their ways, craftsmanship and enjoy a meal in an Amish home. Overnight Peoria, IL (B,L)

Friday, June 19, 2026

We venture back home today, enjoying the company of the new friends made along the way. We make our usual rest and meal stops along the way arriving back home early evening. (B)
